Educate North Carolina residents and organizations about water, wastewater, solid waste and related public health and environmental issues.

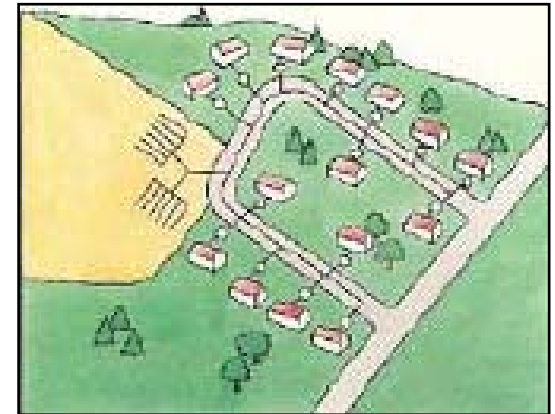

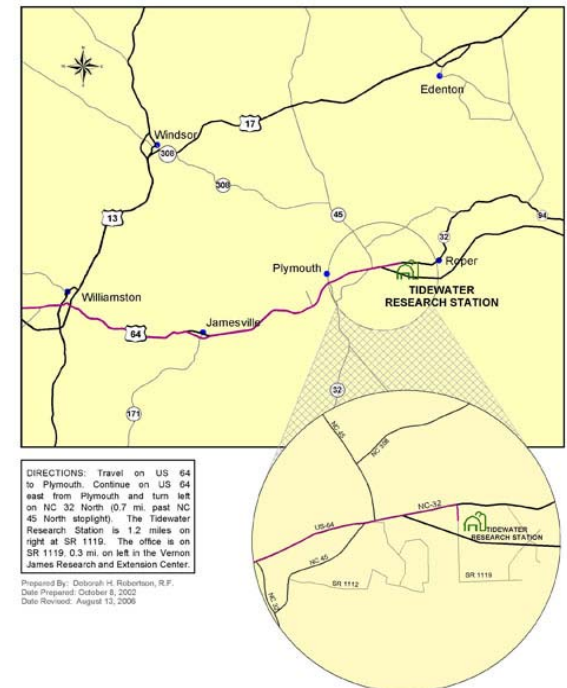
